LOWER SCHOOL TRAFFIC: DROP OFF & PICKUP

More detail appears in your student/parent handbook. We are summarizing it here for your convenience.

CAMPUS TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

Cooperation with regard to our traffic and parking regulations is of the utmost importance. While some regulations cause minor inconvenience, they are a small price to pay for the safety of our children.

Please cooperate with the instructions of campus security officers at all times. They are on duty to ensure safety in the loading zones, and to facilitate a smooth and effective traffic flow. **Cell phone use is strictly prohibited while in the loading zones and parking lots; please focus your complete attention on driving.**

Park only in designated parking spaces. It is essential that we keep the driveway lanes clear and open for bus access and emergency vehicles. **Absolutely no parking in the loading zones is permitted at any time.**

Campus speed limit is 5 mph.

1. Please pick up/drop off your children at the correct loading zone:
 - K, grade 4 and grade 5 - front zone on Bucknall Rd.
 - Grades 1, 2 and 3 - back zone on Rincon Ave.
 - Choose the loading zone according to the youngest child in your car.
 - Prior to 7:30 a.m. and after 5:30 p.m., ALL drop offs and pickups should be at the back loading zone on Rincon.
2. Please adhere to traffic signs posted at exits. Remember, right turn only into and out of both the Bucknall and Rincon loading zones.
3. Students MAY NOT be dropped off on the street or in parking areas.
4. Students should be ready to exit their cars when entering the loading zone. Please have backpacks in the car with your child, ready to go.
5. Kindergartners and grade 1-3 students should wait for assistance to exit the car; grade 4-5 children can exit the car unassisted only if it is safe and within the loading zone area.
6. Check traffic to your left before pulling away from the curb.
7. Do not park and walk your child to class; it limits teacher parking and can be dangerous.
8. Please do not block the sidewalks with your vehicle as you enter and exit each loading zone. Doing so inhibits pedestrians from walking safely in the neighborhood.
