






Tensions for parents of Gen Alpha

The ABCDE of parenting

Acceptance

Make it clear in word and action that your child is accepted.

Boundaries

Communicate rules and expectations clearly.

Consequences

Help children learn that poor choices result in poor outcomes.

Development

Help children grow their social skills to understand the impact on others.

Encouragement

Encourage children, when they make mistakes, to learn from them.














What's Happening in Grade 1 Music?

Children become musical in three ways:

Tuneful - students have tunes in their heads and coordinate their voices to sing those tunes

Beatful - students feel the pulse of music and how that pulse is grouped in twos or threes

Artful - students are moved by music in the many ways that music can elicit an emotional response



The Musical Workout

- Pitch Exploration (Vocal Warm-up)
- Song Fragments
 - Echo Songs / Call-and-Response Songs
- Simple Songs
- Arioso (Child-created Tunes)
- Movement Exploration (Movement Warm-up)


