

PSAT

Standardized Tests

- PSAT (School-organized)
 - Wednesday, October 12th on campus, no academic classes
 - Registration: September 30 in Advisory
 - Scores are NOT sent to colleges
 - National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test
- SAT and/or ACT (Individualized)
 - Recommendation: take SAT or ACT at least once by the end of Junior year

Many colleges & universities continue to be test optional/blind.

2nd Semester 11th grade Spring 2023


- Exploration of self


How can
