






## **BASE Program**





#### Modern and Classical Language Options


Spanish Japanese French Latin Mandarin

#### **CHOICES FOR NEXT YEAR**

FOREIGN LANGUAGE 2 ELECTIVES (& A BACK-UP)

- E-mail with elective course descriptions & link to Google form will be sent to you & your child on Tuesday 1/16
- Discuss options together and then your CHILD fills in the Google form with you watching
- Link requires your child's student login credentials!



#### QUESTIONS FROM YOU

- What is the biggest change in class structure and requirements from 5<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> grade?
  - All classes meet three times each week
  - Foreign Language is like science, history, math, and English – assigns homework (up to 30 min/meeting) and gives assessments

## QUESTION ON CHANGES / ACADEMIC DETAILS (CONT.)

- There should be no more than two tests on any day
- 6<sup>th</sup> graders do <u>not</u> take semester finals
- Schoology helps us stay organized on assignments and course content – but only students have access starting in 6<sup>th</sup> grade

#### QUESTIONS FROM YOU

- How do placement changes happen from 5<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup>?
  - The same as 4<sup>th</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup>. Your child's teachers approve changes based on work your child does all this year.
  - Changes will be communicated by the end of the school year.

#### QUESTIONS FROM YOU

- What are the after school options that are similar to the elective options?
  - Debate club meets after school
  - Students can help tech a show without being in the elective class
  - Math club meets after school
    - Only option in 6<sup>th</sup> grade
    - Elective class for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades


# ADDITIONAL ATHLETICS INFORMATION
