

# How do athletics work at upper school?

A:

- Three seasons: fall, winter, spring, each 3.5-4 mos. long
- Practice five days a week after school for two hours, sometimes Saturdays
- 60% of students play at least one sport
- Great coaching, training and facilities
- Fall sports start 8/10/2020 (except football which starts 8/7/2020) Please plan your summer vacations accordingly.

# C: Does Harker give merit scholarships?

A:

- No, we do not give merit scholarships of any kind.
- Same policy across all bay area independent schools in the Bay Area Admission Directors (BAAD) group
- Also against the California Interscholastic
   Federation (CIF) bylaws in the athletic realm

## **Upper School Admission**

- We will add 35 to 40 new students to grade 9
- Expect 300 applications for these spaces
- Looking to offer admission to students who will add to the upper school community

# **Re-enrolling into Grade 9**

Re-enrollment criteria are in the middle school student/parent handbook.

A letter will be sent in early December to confirm your re-enrollment status.



#### **Re-enrollment Criteria**

#### **Grades**

- Earn a yearly C average or higher in the following academic classes
  - English
  - Math
  - History
  - Science
- Earn a D average or higher in foreign language.

Grades are evaluated using the November gradebook snapshot.

#### **Behavior**

 Exhibit attendance, behavior and citizenship that meets or exceeds the school's expectations as outlined in the handbook.

#### **Re-enrollment Timeline**

- December: Notification letters sent to current eighth graders
- Early February: Contracts sent

Signing the contract and paying the tuition deposit reserves your spot in the grade 9 class.



#### **Academic Dean's Role**

- Meet with Grade 9 students in October
- Help create a fluid 4-year academic course plan
  - Invitation mid-October for student and family to meet individually (Oct.-Jan.)
- Ensure students are in the right classes with a good, balanced life
- Serve as pre-college counselor until 2<sup>nd</sup> semester junior year, including PSAT, SAT/ACT and SAT subject tests information

# Grade 9 Classes Maximum of six academic classes

Subject	Choice/Placement	Placement Options
1. English 1	Placement by teacher	Regular or Honors
2. Math	Placement by teacher	Regular or Honors
3. Physics	Placement by teacher	Regular or Honors
4. World History 1	Placement by teacher	Regular or Honors
5. Foreign Language	Student choice/Placement by teacher	Regular or Honors
6. Study of the Arts	Student preference	theater arts, dance, visual arts music, or technical theater
"Extra Period Option" (non-academic class)	Student choice	Can be a free period; many options, some have audition/application



# Placement by teachers

- Grade 8 teachers make placements for grade 9 classes based on 1<sup>st</sup> semester grades.
- World History 1 Placement: History <u>and</u> English teachers make placement.
  - A- or better in history
  - Continued placement in Honors English OR an Aor better in Advanced Core English

# Foreign Language

Spanish, French, Latin, Japanese & Mandarin

 Completion of level 3 is required for graduation, at least 1 year must be completed at the upper school.

 Choice: continue with current language or begin a new one?

## Study of the Arts

- Provide 2 preferences for the full year:
  - Study of Dance
  - Study of Music
  - Study of Technical Theater
  - Study of Theater Arts
  - Study of Visual Arts

- Free Period
- Performing Arts
  - Vocal (Bel Canto → Downbeat, Cantilena, Camerata)
  - Harker Dance Company (Audition)
  - Instrumental (Orchestra, Lab/Jazz Band)

- P.E.: Personal Fitness




