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AFTER-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES Bucknall Campus: K-5

All students who attend The Harker School may participate in the after-school enrichment and supervision program at no extra charge. All students will have the opportunity to choose from several activity categories:

- Free play is available to all students after school. Students are supervised by BEST staff in grade-level areas.
- **Drop-In Activities** do not require registration, and are included in tuition. Options include both passive and active activities, and are announced after school. Students may choose to drop in to these activities between 3:45-4:45 p.m.
- Learning Workshop Classes require quarterly registration, and are included in tuition. Students must make a commitment to attend for the entire quarter. These classes may vary each quarter depending on availability, and have included fun options such as Storytelling, and Where in the World.
- Specialty Classes, such as karate, science and instrumentals, require registration and an additional fee. These engaging classes are taught by outside organizations from our local community. Please note that these class fees will be billed to your Harker account. If your child opts to drop a specialty class, you must do so prior to the second class meeting to avoid charges being made to student accounts. Otherwise, full payment is expected. When dropping a class, written notice to the BEST department is required by emailing

- Students may mix and match activities from any category as long as the class schedules do not conflict. Please read the following pages for a complete listing of all scheduled after-school opportunities.

DROP-IN ACTIVITIES

- · Are chosen by students daily.
- Are designed for students who wish to attend for as little or as long as desired and do not require registration.
- Most drop-in activities are announced after school or are scheduled to take place on certain days of the week.

ART

Grades: 1-5

Art is one of the most popular activities offered in the after school program! Drop-in Art is offered at least two days per week and space is limited. Students may drop in to create, imagine, relax and try out interesting art materials and techniques.



ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

Grades: K, 1-3 and 4-5

Join in on a wide variety of active and passive activities implemented by our imaginative and energetic BEST staff. Choose to get up and get moving, or to relax, create and reflect. If feeling active, students can learn the value of good sportsmanship, teamwork and cooperation. On a more passive afternoon, students can opt to let their creativity flow with projects like making crafts, blowing bubbles, molding clay or playing board games. New activities are offered each day and are designed to be age-appropriate for each grade level area. These activities are the perfect way to have fun with friends, stay engaged and participate fully in after-school on a drop-in basis.

STUDY AREAS

Grades: 1-5

Want to get a head start on your homework? Have a test you want to start studying for? Well this is the place for you! A quiet classroom or table area is designated for grades 1-3, the library is available for grades 3-5, and a 10th period classroom is open for grades 4-5.

LEARNING WORKSHOPS (See pg. 17 for Performing Arts)

The following choices are enrichment activities designed to augment classroom instruction in specific subject areas. These workshops require registration and attendance is monitored.

- Students enrolling must make a commitment to attend class for the entire quarter and parents must notify the BEST department if they wish their student to be dropped from the class.
- Classes meet one day per week for either 45 minutes, one hour, or one hour and 15 minutes.
- Learning Workshops are filled on a first-come, first-served basis, so
 make sure to go online to register during our registration timeframe. The

ART

Grades: 1-5

For those students who love to be creative, art is for you! We offer several arts genres throughout the year, such as drawing, painting, sculpting and more. Students will be able to explore a variety of art tools and media in an environment where they can express themselves creatively and joyfully. They are encouraged to explore, create and achieve through process-based projects. The students will also have opportunities for free-choice art work to practice newly learned techniques. Art students will gain and enhance their artistic skills, stimulate their imagination, and build their self-confidence.

BETTER TOGETHER

Grade: K-2

Join this class to play and learn with your peers! Have fun making connections with team bonding activities. Practice positive ways to communicate and build each other up. Led by Ms. Pamela, we can't wait to get better, together!

FUTURE PROBLEM SOLVERS (FPS)

Grade: 5

Meets weekly Q1 & Q2 Only; however, please be aware that participants will be involved with the program the whole year.

FPS (motto: "Teaching students how to think, not what to think.") is an international organization teaching and developing critical thinking skills. There is a significant writing and social component because students are expected to clearly articulate their ideas and work together as a fixed team of four throughout the year as they learn to develop and break down any issue

or topic. Teams research each topic and then assess a hypothetical future crisis. Assessments include extensive explanations of challenges, solutions

and a detailed plan of putting a winning solution into action. In the spring there is also an innovative skit component where students also creatively show their plan in action. FPS develops a multitude of skills including team building, creative thinking and leadership.

Please note: This is only for the dedicated student. If you think you may drop at a later date, this class is not for you! FPS requires a yearlong commitment:



Q1 & Q2 in an after-school training and Q3 and Q4, at mandatory weekend training sessions spread out across October, December, February and April (specific dates are not set yet). If a member of a team is missing it is unfair to the other members of that particular team. Teams will be partnered with their own mentor from the upper school to help them improve their understanding of this amazing, but intense, process.

Brick Techniques STEM basics with LEGO®

Grade: Kindergarten

Join Brick Tech as we introduce your child to STEM basics by building guided projects out of LEGO® pieces! Each LEGO® project will showcase relevant STEM concepts, such as a motorized helicopter to discuss gear drives or a skyscraper with bricks to introduce overlapping construction, fostering handson learning for participants. One project will be introduced each day of class and students will have the remaining time to build, discover, and learn with additional LEGO® pieces. There are no prerequisites for this class.

Design & Drive with LEGO®

Grades: 1-3

Are you a LEGO® gear head? Then come learn all about vehicles with Brick Tech this fall! Participants will be introduced to a variety of mechanical engineering concepts-from chassis types to aerodynamic design through hands-on building with LEGO®. Grades: 4-5

In this course, students will build projects that will introduce robotics concepts while also learning to program with a scratch based programming language. Projects will include use of color, distance and touch sensors. There are no prerequisites for this class.

Grades: K-5

Chess (Beginners through Advanced)

Kids Creative Adventures has been sparking the imagination of children since 1989. We offer a wide selection of fun programs throughout the school year in a safe and engaging environment. Classes are created and led by Robyn Kline, professional animator, cartoonist, illustrator and graphic designer.

Cartooning - Drawing Adventures (Q1)

Grades: K-5

This exciting directed drawing class is taught by a professional illustrator. Students will learn the fundamentals of drawing as they create their own masterpieces based on popular themes, such as How to Train Your Dragon, Minecraft, Moana, Pokemon, Dog Man, Lilo & Stitch, and Hotel Transylvania.

Dragon Adventure Workshop (Q1)

Grades: K-5

Join us for a fun quarter of dragon drawing, crafts and creative activities. Design your own Dragon sketch book - we will draw many of the characters from How to Train Your Dragon, Wings of Fire, Harry Potter and more! This class is full of drawing, games, puzzles, puppets and dragon-themed fun.

Board Game Design

Grades: K-5

Use your brilliant imagination to create your own board game! We will teach you game design and layout. Each student will receive their own professional

blank board game, timer, dice, pawns, spinner, cards and money. Have fun teaching your game to your family and friends.

Character & Comic Book Design

Grades: K-5

This class is designed for the student interested in the style of Japanese Anime, character and /or comic book design. We will begin each class with warm- up drawing exercises such as how to draw hands, facial expressions, backgrounds etc. Each class will concentrate on a different lesson such as character introduction, story lines, comic covers and lettering. Students will then work at an independent pace to create their own characters that may be incorporated into their own comic book if they like. Class fees include all art supplies, handouts, note books, plastic card pages, color copying and lamination of all character cards and a special drawing surprises!

Pokemon Power

Grades: K-5

Gotta catch 'em all! Catch several characters in your Pokemon drawing book. Create Pokemon puppets and sculpt Play-Doh creatures. Compete for prizes in our team engineering challenges, mazes, puzzles and games. Design your own Pokemon cards to trade and make a catapult to launch your Poke Balls. If you love Pokemon, this is the class for you!

ENACTE ARTS

EnActe School of Drama offers innovative, holistic, bespoke drama-based programs that not only teach theater skills, but also life skills through theater. We believe film and theater arts skills are essential for any life path. These artistic experiences teach self-thought, adaptability, resourcefulness, and social competence skills like presentation, perception and persuasion.

Critical Thinking & Creative Writing

Grades: 2-5, meets two times per week

Our popular program is designed for either elementary or middle schoolers. A typical day begins with a screening of a short animated film (3-8 minutes), then delves into story analysis and design in order to help students think critically to creatively write a story using the same logical/narrative structures. Each class ends with each student having an outline for a clearly communicated coherent narrative. This program helps students learn the invaluable skill of clear and persuasive communication from a basis of storytelling. Ultimately, students will have the structures necessary to make arguments, change minds, and impact the future. Students will walk away with a portfolio of story outlines they have brainstormed during their time in the class.

No Fear, Drama is Here!

Grades: 2-5

Our classic theater and film acting class provides an immersive, collaborative and educational experience. Students will have custom scenes written for them by a professional writer, each working on their specific challenges and framed around their personal needs. They will learn projection through vocality, critical thinking through script analysis, creativity through character dimensionalization, command through stage/screen presence, and confidence through emotional exploration. Through all of these tools, students will find a new way of communicating and succeeding with the world around them.

From Faces to Fables

Grades: K-1

Step into the world of masks and storytelling! A dynamic program that blends art, culture and technology to bring characters to life! Students will explore the significance of masks in theater traditions from around the world, including Greek theater, Commedia dell'Arte, Kathakali, Japanese Noh and African traditions. They will design and craft their own unique masks using papier-mâché, paints and patterns.

Laugh Out Loud!

Grades: 1-3

A fun-filled program for kids to build confidence, improve communication, and explore comedy! Through improv games, silly warm-ups and character creation, students learn the secrets of humor using dialogue, body language and props. With a focus on teamwork and self-expression, they'll develop comedic timing while ensuring laughter is inclusive and kind. The program culminates in group skits that combine learned elements - characters, dialogue, physical comedy and props. Instructors ensure students learn comedy respectfully, making everyone feel included and comfortable.

Teambuilding Through Story

Grades: K-1

Our introduction to performance through classic storytelling provides a safe space for students to explore their imaginations and emotions through theater games and performance. Students will work collaboratively in an ensemble performance-based retelling of a storybook, under the guidance of a professional storyteller. They will learn how to work as a team, become stewards of their community, how to project their voices, communicate with their body and exercise critical thinking skills through story analysis and game play. Through all of these tools, students will find a new way of communicating and succeeding with the world around them.

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Ted Talks Toolkit

Grades: 3-5

Is your child going to change the world? This class will give your student the opportunity to think about big ideas in a way they can digest and communicate their own big ideas to shape the future. Each class, the students will watch a short TedTalk given by someone between the ages of 6-15 and engage in a critical analysis of the ideas presented within their cohort. Then students innovate their own new projects and share their ideas with their peers. This process will challenge their ideas and ultimately teach them about persuasion, public speaking, charisma, stage presence, clarity, and other leadership skills! Students will have a blast while learning fundamental skills that will help them in their future careers. As a final project, students will write, perform, and record their own TedTalks which can be shared with their friends and family!

FENCING

Instructor: Ania Tibbetts

Grades: K-5

This is an introductory fencing class in which students will learn basic footwork, bladework, practice drills, play games, and enjoy a fun-filled and safe program of swordplay. Additionally, fencing students develop confidence & poise, coordination, and problem-solving skills. The class is taught by a professional fencing master who has trained complete beginners to elite world class athletes. She is committed to nurturing the potential of every fencer, from their very first lesson to the highest levels of competition. .Class sizes will be small, and equipment is provided.

GO GO SKATEBOARDING LESSONS

Skateboarding

Grades: 1-5

Go Go Skateboarding was established in an effort to provide California youth (and the young at heart) with high-quality skateboard programs and services. Our mission is to shed light on the mental attributes needed to conquer fears and reach our goals. With safety a top priority, students will be introduced to skateboard fundamentals where we will learn to be creative, overcome self-doubts, and never give up! All the necessary equipment including skateboards and safety gear are provided to the students.

GYMKIDS USA

Grades: K-5

Cheerleading: Cheer Kids

Learn to shake your sparkly pom poms and show your Harker Eagles spirit! Beginning cheer lessons focus on proper technique, cheer positions, cheer jumps, Eagle chants and cheers. Fun pom-pom drill team dance routines will be taught to popular, age-appropriate music. Seasonal cheers and chants for sports and beginning gymnastics will be introduced. Cheerleading and gymnastic skills are taught based on readiness, physical ability and age-appropriateness of each student. Basic cheer positions, warm-up routine and beginning cartwheels are also taught. Mini stunts will be introduced to grade 2-5 students. Lessons are conducted outdoors. Classes are taught indoors pending weather. Taught by Ms. Melinda, Owner GymKids USA. Performing: ALL cheerleaders perform on the last day of every quarter during the afterschool meeting for students. K-5 cheer students will cheer at on-campus Harker games when they fall on a cheerleading class day. Grade 2-5 cheer students will also perform at the Harker Homecoming football game in the fall, which is optional and not required for the cheer class.

AWARDS: Certificates are awarded at the end of every quarter to validate every child's efforts. MEDALS are awarded at the end of the school year for students who have participated in all four quarters of Cheerleading class.

CHEERLEADER PARENT NOTES - Requirements:

- Pom Poms: One-time pom pom fee of \$40, which includes a cheer bag for poms. Students will be given pom poms in class and they will be charged to your Harker account. Pom-poms are all identical for Harker performances. Poms are professional (not toys) and specifically made for the sport of cheerleading. Returning students please bring your pom poms to class.
- Waiver: Parents/Guardians must complete and sign a GymKids USA waiver before class begins. Waivers are to be completed and filled out only once per school year. Waiver form will be provided through a welcome email and handed out on the first day of class.
- Attire and Shoes: Wear comfortable, movable clothing. School uniform is acceptable with pants or shorts under jumpers. Wear proper ankle support athletic tennis shoes.
- Hair: Pull hair back with a ponytail on cheerleading day. Students need to safely see where they are going and landing while practicing cartwheels and basic tumbling.

Rhythmic Gymnastics

Gym Kids classes combine rhythmic gymnastics and traditional gymnastics tumbling in one class. Students will learn gymnastic dance routines and circus style tricks with the long ribbon, hoop, ball and rope apparatuses. Students are also taught basic tumbling skills, cartwheels and drills using specialty mats. Gymnastics are taught at the introductory and beginning level based on age appropriateness and skill level of each student. A fun gymnastic obstacle course with cones, river rocks, jump-over bars and balance beam are included in every lesson. This program covers proper agility, coordination, strength and flexibility development. Careful attention to proper technique, stretching, warm-up and, above all, safety is stressed in every class. K and grade 1 students will be introduced to the long ribbon, short ribbon and hoop apparatus. Grade 2-5 students will be introduced to the long ribbon, hoop, ball and rope apparatus. An optional performance for grade 2-5 students occurs on the last day of every quarter during the afterschool meeting for students. Classes will be taught indoors and occasionally outdoors pending lessons and apparatus used. AWARDS: Certificates are awarded at the end of every quarter to validate every child's efforts. MEDALS are awarded at the end of the school year for students who have participated in all four quarters of gymnastics class. Taught by Ms. Melinda, Owner GymKids USA.

RHYTHMIC GYMNASTIC PARENT NOTES - Requirements:

- Waiver: Parents/Guardians must complete and sign a GymKids USA waiver before class begins. Waivers are to be completed and filled out only once per school year. Waiver form will be provided through a welcome email and handed out on the first day of class.
- Attire: Wear comfortable movable clothing. School uniform is acceptable with pants or shorts under jumpers.
- Hair: Pull hair back with a ponytail on gymnastics day. Students need to safely see where they are going and landing while practicing cartwheels and basic tumbling.

Yoga Acrobats

A fun combination class in beginning Yoga and Acrobats, including yoga animal poses, partner balancing yoga and gymnastic movement. Individual and partner acrobatic balancing drills and skills are introduced. Our unique class combines flexibility, strength, concentration, coordination, balance and imagination while enjoying fun movement. A relaxing environment with soft music. Breathing exercises are important and are kept very simple for kids. Gym mats, bean bags, scarves, yoga obstacle course and balance beam will be used to enhance learning. Yoga, gymnastic movement and acrobatic balancing skills are taught based on readiness and age appropriateness of each student. Cartwheels are not taught in this class. OPTIONAL YOGA MAT:

Child-sized yoga mats will be provided. Students may bring their own (child-sized) mat if desired. AWARDS: Certificates are awarded at the end of every quarter to validate each child's effort. Medals are awarded at the end of the school year for students who have participated in all four quarters of Yoga Acrobats class. Taught by Ms. Melinda, owner of GymKids USA

YOGA ACROBATS PARENT NOTES - Requirements:

- Waiver: Parents/Guardians must complete and sign a GymKids USA waiver before class begins. Waivers are to be completed and filled out only once per school year. Waiver form will be provided through a welcome email and handed out on the first day of class.
- Attire: Wear comfortable movable clothing. School uniform is acceptable with pants or shorts under jumpers.
- Hair: Pull hair back with a ponytail on yoga acrobats day so your child may see safely during their lessons.

KYOSHIN-RYU KARATE

Kyoshin-Ryu is derived from the Japanese words "Kyoshin" meaning "a mind like a mirror" and "Ryu" referring to the style or type of art practiced. Kyoshin-Ryu embodies profound philosophical principles intertwined with martial arts mastery. Our philosophy is to emphasize constant self-improvement and societal betterment. We encourage our students to continuously grow, striving to enhance themselves and create a positive impact on the world.

Karate: Beginner

Grades: K-3

Introduction to basic Karate techniques, forms and self defense applications. Each quarter, we will improve upon our foundation and learn new moves. Students will practice low, leg strengthening stances and attention to detail with precise techniques. We will engage the mind with memorization through forms and how to control yourself and your emotions. As a student advances in rank, they will practice leadership through demonstrations of what they've learned and how to teach under supervision. We will balance out hard work with fun and engaging Karate!

Karate: Advanced

Grades: 4-5

This class is for the most dedicated Karateka. Students are expected to be serious about their learning and put in their best effort every day. We will push ourselves to the limits using more difficult moves and forms while understanding the application of complicated self defense techniques.

WHIZARA

JavaScript Programming

Grades: 4-5

Whizara's Introduction to JavaScript programming course introduces students to the fundamentals of browser-based application development via its fun, graphics, animation and game-based engaging curriculum. Students learn the fundamentals of programming including variables, user inputs/output, random, conditionals, loops, functions, events, lists and more. Throughout the course, students develop a range of browser-based applications and a course-end project to showcase their learnings. The programming concepts learned in this course are transferable to any other programming language. No prior coding experience is required to participate in this class. A Chromebook or any computer/PC with internet connectivity is required to join the course.

Financial Literacy

Grades: 3-5

This Financial Literacy course for grades 3-5 empowers students with essential knowledge and skills to make informed financial decisions. Through interactive activities, engaging discussions, and hands-on projects, students explore key concepts such as needs versus wants, goal setting and prioritization, decision-making, and future planning. The course fosters a positive attitude towards money, enhances critical thinking, and encourages responsible financial behavior, preparing students for a financially secure future.

Mobile App Development

Grades: 4-5

This course introduces students to MIT App Inventor. Students understand the purpose and the user interface of App Inventor, and use it to build several applications/games. As students build these projects, they explore core programming concepts and the different aspects of App Inventor, including adding components and design their layouts, the blocks editor, and writing scripts to add behavior to the components. No prior experience with coding is required to participate in this course. Device prerequisite:
(i) Laptop/Computer (Windows or Mac) and Phone/Tablet (Android/Apple) or emulator in case there's no access to Phone/Tablet OR (ii) HYPERLINK "https://appinventor.mit.edu/support/chromebooks" Android capable Chromebook). Python Programming

Grades: 4-5

Whizara's Introduction to Python Programming course introduces students to the fundamentals of syntax-based programming via its fun, graphics, animation, and game-based engaging curriculum. Students learn the fundamental programming concepts including variables, user inputs/output, random, conditionals, loops, functions, events, list and more. The course further reinforces computational concepts of sequencing, pattern recognition, parallelism and algorithmic thinking, and software development process. No prior coding experience is required to participate in this course. A Chromebook or any computer/PC with internet connectivity is required to join the course.

CODE ADVANTAGE

Code Advantage delivers fun, educational experiences in interactive environments made for learning, creating, and mastering technology skills. We don't just teach coding and robotics - we create learning environments for kids to develop logical thinking, creative exploration, and critical reasoning skills. while having fun.

Scratch Junior

Grades: K-2

Learning to code is a critical skill for children to learn! Much like learning another language, it's best to have kids learn about programming concepts early and often! In our Scratch Jr class, kids will learn coding concepts including computer automation and linear sequencing. They will make short stories, apply elements of animation, and create their own sprites and objects – all using technology and coding fundamentals!

Scratch Programming

Grades: 1-5

The Scratch class provides a powerful learning tool for budding programmers. Using an advanced block coding format, Scratch teaches fundamental programming concepts. Students learn these critical concepts by creating animations and computer games with interacting characters. Students will apply problem-solving skills to debug programs, make customizations and bring their imaginations to life!

Minecraft Code: World Adventure

Grades: 1-3

Grab your passports, we are off to explore new worlds within the Minecraft realm! Students will learn to move, explore, build, and code within Minecraft while visiting exciting places including ancient Egypt, Tokyo Disneyland,

Chicago, the wizarding world of Hogwarts, and more! Students will use their knowledge and creativity to design projects on their own. Students do not need prior experience with Minecraft.

Story Time with AI (Grades 3-5)

Students harness the power of AI technology to support and enhance their creativity while building a unique multimedia story, combining original ideas with the power of AI! Along the way, learn about creative writing, AI ethics, and a range of AI tools. Fully develop main characters including personality, imagery and more. Students will use AI to create visuals to represent story locations and utilize ChatGPT to enhance your existing story ideas. You will also be challenged to think critically about AI-generated content, its many uses, and its limitations. Note: This class is structured like a creative writing class, but every step of the process uses AI tools to prompt creativity and fully realize students' ideas.

SCIENCE MADE FUN

Grades: K-3

HIGH TOUCH HIGH TECH

High Touch High Tech enrichments provide students with a unique, interactive experience that brings science concepts to life. In this hands-on science class, students will explore various topics among chemistry, physical, life and earth sciences. Each week the students will discover a new and engaging scientific concept, which will be accompanied by two or three hands-on experiments which bring the concept to life. Students roll up their sleeves and become REAL scientists! Note: The same concepts will be covered in both classes. For the upper grade levels, we will increase the depth of explanation and time permitting, may include an extra experiment. Different topics will be covered each quarter, so students can sign up year-long to explore across the scientific disciplines. Most concepts covered will be the same year-over-year.

YOUNG ART LESSONS

With Young Art, students are encouraged to be courageous and use bold creativity to practice problem-solving which will prepare them to make an impact in the future. Young Art celebrates experimentation, sparks the makings of lifelong adventurers, and lays the foundation for innovative thought processes that develop independent, unconventional leaders. Our creative team will guide your learners through how to bring their imagination to life on canvas, screen, sketchbook, and more!

Draw & Paint Techniques

Grades: K-2

In this series, students will learn pencil sketching, animal drawing, landscapes, and

watercoloring. Teachers will go over drawing techniques that encourage a step-bystep breakdown using simple shapes, followed by coloring and shading techniques, and will conclude the session with an overview of basic painting techniques.

Digital Art

Grades: 3-5

Students will explore digital illustration techniques and principles using Procreate. New projects will be introduced each week, allowing students to deepen their understanding of composition, color theory, character design, and more. Students will also be able to master various painting techniques, understand the principles of shading and light and get to know the Procreate app inside out.

Mixed Media

Grade: K-2

In this class, students will have the opportunity to learn various mediums and subjects, including watercolor, animal drawing and pencil sketching.

Teachers will go over drawing techniques that encourage a step-by-step breakdown using simple shapes, followed by coloring and shading techniques, and will conclude the session with an overview of basic painting techniques.

PERFORMING ARTS

Performing arts classes are offered at Harker both during the academic day and after school. After school classes are offered in choral music, dance, instrumental music and technical theater. These classes teach students the technique of each discipline, allow them to explore their creativity and give them the opportunity to perform. Listed below are all of the performing arts classes offered after school. CHORAL MUSIC

Grades 4-5 Lower School Concert Choir

Material fee: \$30

Lower School Concert Choir is a yearlong performance-based ensemble for students who are passionate about singing and eager to improve their musicianship skills in a group setting. Students will develop their vocal technique and tone during weekly rehearsals while learning challenging repertoire in a variety of musical styles.

Members of Lower School Concert Choir have many opportunities to perform. Annual performance ev ents include the K-12 holiday assembly, United Voices concert, and the winter and spring lower school music concerts. Lower School Concert Choir gives students the skills they need to continue their musical pursuit in middle school.

Students must take after-school grade level dance ALL YEAR to be eligible to perform in the dance concert. The annual dance concert is at the end of May. There is a \$90 production fee to be in the dance concert, but no cost to take dance. New students are encouraged to try dance, so they don't miss out on being in the show. Grade 4-5 students can do both after-school sports and dance. This class will teach students the fundamentals of dance. Jazz and ballet skills form the basis for the center floor warm-up. Dance offers students the opportunity to explore movement, be creative, move to music and have a great time! Quarter 1, 2 and 3 after-school dance classes will focus on reviewing dance skills, learning new dance steps and working on dance technique. Quarter 4 students will be taught a routine for the grade 1-5 dance concert with emphasis on learning how to perform and perfect their moves. 

All students must be picked up by 6 p.m., as campus closes and BEST staff end their day at that time. After 6 p.m., students who are not picked up by the close of school will remain with the BEST staff in the grade 1-3 area or an adjacent classroom. A \$2 per minute late charge will be posted on the student's account for extended care.
