



Pertussis Immunization Booster/Tdap (Whooping Cough)

California law requires all students entering seventh grade to show proof of having received a booster shot containing pertussis (whooping cough) after the age of 7. The last time your child had this immunization was just before entering kindergarten and immunity to pertussis wanes over time. Most pediatricians give this shot, called Tdap (tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis) at the annual physical exam when a child turns 11 or 12. When you check your child's immunization record for the Tdap, it will be in the sixth slot of the DTP section.

By law, students who have not submitted proof of their record of immunization by the start of school will not be able to attend school until documentation is submitted. We find that many incoming seventh graders have not yet received their Tdap shot, so be sure there is proof of Tdap immunization on your record before submitting it.

MORE INFORMATION ABOUT TDAP:

A new school immunization law requires all students entering grades 7-12 in California to be immunized with a pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine booster called Tdap.

The new law states that, in order to begin school, each student must have a Tdap booster on or after their 10th birthday AND the school must have a "Notice of Tdap Booster Requirement" form, OR a copy of your immunization record with current Tdap, on file for each student.

Parents are also encouraged to contact their doctor's office for further clarification and/or confirmation as to whether their child has had the booster.
