Asian Americans are the third most racially targeted group following Black Americans and Jewish Americans. Asian Americans are also the racial group least likely to reach out for help. This, coupled with an already existing belief that AAPIs don't struggle (the model minority myth), has only worsened the pandemic-related problems in the community. Allowing space to have conversations about these important issues will help raise awareness, build community, and foster understanding.




Workshop for parents about talking to children about racial identity, bullying, and anti-Asian racism from January 2021: Immigrant History


